BELIZE MURDER RATE SEES NOTABLE DECLINE

For the first time since 2013, Belize has registered a murder rate below what is deemed to be civil war levels, at **24.33 per 100,000 inhabitants**. The Belize Crime Observatory had projected a rate of about 25 per 100,000, based on trends.

Official statistics released by the Belize Police Department, indicate that there were 102 murders recorded in Belize during January to December 2020. This represents a reduction of 32 incidents (from 134), amounting to a decline of 23.88%.

The decline was recorded for both male and female victims.

BELIZE CITY CONTINUES TO POSE UNIQUE CHALLENGE

Despite a marked decline in murders nationally during 2020, Belize City recorded the same amount of murders that it did the previous year. There were 47 murders recorded in that municipality during January to December 2020 and the same period during 2019. Since the population is estimated to have grown marginally, the murder rate registered a nominal decline.

City murders constituted a higher percentage of the national total in 2020 than they did in 2019.

The situation improved in Precincts 3 and 4 (the City's northside) but worsened in Precincts 1 and 2 (the City's southside). No murders were recorded in Precinct 4.

Beginning March 2020, a series of States of Emergencies were implemented, targeting gang operatives in specific parts of Belize City. There were also States of Emergencies and movement restrictions implemented to contain the spread of the COVID-19 Pandemic.

BELIZE AND CAYO DISTRICTS REGISTERED MARKED DECLINES

Overall, the Belize District recorded a notable decline in murders, as did three other districts: Orange Walk, Cayo, and Toledo. However, there was an increase registered in Corozal and Stann Creek.

The murder rate in the Belize District declined from 61.24 in 2019 to 46.21 in 2020. Cayo registered a precipitous decline from 25.22 to 11.75.
