




SUMMARY

The country of Belize saw a noted reduction in major crimes during 2019, with the largest declines reported for robberies and burglaries, followed by murder and theft. However, reports of sexual violence increased. Total major crime incidents reported for the period January to December 2019 declined by roughly 7.80% when compared with the same period in 2018 (down from 1,371 to 1,264 or 107 reports). Although June, August and September recorded increases relative to the same time in 2018, there has been a sustained overall decline since July. For the month of December 2019, 94 major crimes were reported by the Belize Police Department. This represents a decrease of 6.93% relative the same month last year, when 101 incidents were reported and a decrease of 9.62% when compared to the previous month, for which 104 major crime incidents were recorded by police.


Major Crimes Count and Year-on-yearChange by Month




The Belize District (which accounts for about 30% of the national population, based on mid-year 2019 estimates by the Statistical Institute of Belize - SIB) accounted for roughly 3 in 10 (or 29.79%) of the major crimes recorded during the month of December 2019, and 38.29% of major crimes for the period January to December 2019. It recorded an overall decline of 145 reports (from 629 to 484 or 23.05%) – the largest relative decline of any district for 2019. During December, major crime reports furthermore plummeted in the Belize District to March levels (28 reports)—the lowest monthly count for the district during 2019.

The Cayo District, which accounts for roughly a quarter of the country's population, based on the SIB's population estimates, accounted for about 2 in 10 (21.60%) of major crimes for the 12-month period. Major crime counts in the Cayo District had generally been trending towards an increase, although there had been a consistent decline since the peak in July 2019. December recorded the lowest major crimes count in that district since April 2019. Overall, though, major crime counts in the Cayo District increased by 31 during 2019 (from 242 to 273 or 12.81%). Notably, Stann Creek recorded a larger count of major crimes than Cayo in December 2019, although Cayo recorded a higher cumulative count for the 12-month period. Orange Walk and Toledo recorded the highest increases for 2019. Cayo recorded the third largest increase.







As detailed below, the number of reports of murder recorded in December 2019 were up by 50% when compared with the same month last year (from 10 to 15). Reports of major theft (of items valued BZ\$5,000 and above) increased (from 6 to 10), while burglary reports were down by 22% (from 63 to 49). The number of sexual violence reports did not change.

MURDER



Fifteen murders were recorded in Belize during December 2019, an increase of 50% from December 2018, when 10 murders were recorded.




For the period January to December 2019, 134 murders were recorded, down from 143 for 2018. This represents a decline of 9 (or 6.29%).


4 of the 15 murders recorded during December were reported in the Belize District, 3 of them in the rural area.

About 6 in 10 (or 56.72%) of the murders recorded for 2019 were reported in the Belize District.

There were 75 property crimes recorded during December 2019, down 12.79% from 86 in December 2018. For 2019, 1,033 property crimes were recorded in the major crimes category, excluding theft of items valued below BZ\$5,000. This represents an overall decline of 10.79%, from 1,158 incidents recorded during the same period in 2018.

About 8 out of every 10 major crimes reported continue to be property crimes.



Sexual violence (rape and unlawful sexual intercourse) were the only types of major crimes that recorded an overall increase in 2019. Reports of rape were up from 21 to 30 (or 42.86%), while reports of unlawful sexual intercourse were up from 49 to 67 (or 36.73%). Furthermore, sexual violence reports were unchanged, with 4 cases recorded during December 2019, as well as December 2018.

GANG-RELATED MAJOR CRIMES

During December 2019, at least 6 gang-related major crime incidents were reported in Belize City, as well as 4 shooting incidents. (*See disaggregation of gang-related major crime incidents below.*)



The total number of suspected gang-related crimes in Belize City for December 2019, including incidents of aggravated assault, was virtually unchanged relative to the same month last year. There was also a reported increase in gang-related robberies (up from 2 to 4), but no increase in incidents of burglary and theft deemed to have been gang-related. Reports of gang-related theft declined from 2 in December 2018 to 0 in December 2019. There was a decline in murders but an increase in shootings deemed gang-related.




MANNER OF DEATH


During December 2019, the National Forensic Science Service examined 64 deaths (49 males and 15 females). Over half (20 of 37) were violent deaths classified as homicides (20), suicides (3), and road traffic accident (RTA) fatalities (14). The preliminary estimate is that for the period January to December 2019, the department performed autopsies on 143 homicide victims, 28 suicide victims and 87 victims of fatal road traffic accidents – a total of 258 victims.






Number of Violent Deaths by District and Proportion by Type, for December 2019

The National Forensic Science Service (Scenes of Crime Unit) processed 271 scenes during December 2019. The most prevalent incident type (suspected at the time of processing the scene) was burglary, for which 85 scenes were processed. A total of 56 road traffic accident, 13 homicide and 1 suicide scenes were also processed.



IMPRISONMENT

During the month of December 2019, 62 people (12 females and 50 males) were listed as newly convicted inmates at the Belize Central Prison, an increase of 15% from December 2018, when 53 were recorded. During December 2019, there were 77 people (2 females and 75 males) remanded to prison – an increase of 19% when compared with December 2018, when 62 were remanded.


Number of People Convicted and Remanded, Disaggregated by Sex, for January to December 2019



■ Convicted Male ■ Convicted Female ■ Remanded Male ■ Remanded Female



Proportion of Incarcerated Inmates by Sex and Status for December 2019










GLOSSARY

Gang-related Crime: a criminal offence carried out by a gang or member of a gang, as classified by the Belize Police Department. The 2018 Amendment to The Crime Control and Criminal Justice legislation (Chapter 102 of the Laws of Belize) regards "any criminal activity or any enterprise, pursuit or undertaking in relation to a serious offence, acquiesced in, or consented or agreed to, or directed, ordered, authorized, requested or ratified by any gang member" as gang-related activity, and includes a schedule of serious offences under the wider classification of gang-related activities.

Homicide: the unlawful killing of a human being by another human being, either intentionally or not. The homicide classification used in this report is based on the classification by the National Forensic Science Service, for reporting purposes and includes murder and manslaughter.

Major Crime: The Belize Police Department includes six crime types under its classification of major crimes: murder, rape, unlawful sexual intercourse, robbery, burglary and theft. Only theft of items valued BZ\$5,000 and above are included among major crimes.

Police Formation/Precinct: The Belize Police Department operates 17 policing areas, referred to as formations and precincts. The Belize City area is divided into four precincts: Precinct 1, Precinct 2, Precinct 3, and Precinct 4. Orange Walk has one police formation, and so does Corozal. Punta Gorda is the police formation for the entire Toledo District. Stann Creek is divided into three policing areas: Placencia, Dangriga and the Intermediate Southern Formation in Independence Village. The divisions exist for operational purposes and are not necessarily geographic. For example, the Belmopan Formation includes some surrounding villages, such as Roaring Creek and Armenia.

Property Crimes: robberies, burglary and theft, involving the deprivation of the victim of any form of property, including cash, livestock, household goods, motor vehicles, etc.

Sexual Violence: The two major crimes classified as sexual violence in this report are rape and unlawful sexual intercourse.

Suicide: The act of an individual taking his or her own life.

Violent Death: Any form of death that results from an external factor, such as the use of a weapon or any object, toxin, or means of force, either by another person or the victim, whether the fatality was accidentally or intentionally caused. This report focuses on three types of violent deaths: homicides, suicides and road traffic fatalities.
